

WELCOME FROM OUR FOUNDERS



Since our establishment in 2010 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, Colorado Futuretek has continued to pursue our mission to provide enrichment training and resources to help African American and other underrepresented minority high school students obtain marketable skills in the Information Technology and Computer industries.

In this regard, we have established a set of successful, ongoing programs that we believe are practical and positive ways to help these students become productive citizens who will help fill the widely recognized need for technically trained professionals over the next decade.

We continue to move forward during 2018-19. As a local Cisco Networking Academy, we taught our ninth year of our SummerTEK classes this year, using the CCNA R&S Introduction to Networks online curriculum.

SummerTEK is our 6-week Cisco Networking Academy course for high school students, which is a first step that can help prepare

students for exciting careers in the IT and Computer industries. The knowledge gained in SummerTEK is also valuable to those who wish to start their own business. In addition to learning technical concepts, our students also improved their teamwork, problem-solving and verbal/written communication skills.

Through our Student Internship Program, we work to facilitate internships for students who excel in SummerTEK.

We taught Computer Networking elective classes at the Denver School of Science and Technology (DSST) Montview (formerly Stapleton) High School for the fourth year in a row.

This year we also hosted a Financial Management Workshop for teens, provided by Operation Hope.

Colorado Futuretek also provided our seventh annual Summer SilverTeks program, which included a 2-week beginners' course and a 2-week intermediate course for senior citizens. Our instructors were assisted by Colorado Futuretek teen student tutors, who worked one-on-one with the senior citizens, and were awarded stipends. Summer SilverTeks is a win-win, giving valuable assistance to senior citizens and providing a valuable experience and work opportunity for our students.

In alignment with our vision, we helped to facilitate paid summer internships during 2019 for nine students who have excelled in our training programs.

A major key to our success has been our ability to collaborate with businesses, community organizations, schools, and churches to help recruit students, to provide facilities for our programs, and to place students in internships. Many thanks to Pastor Eugene M. Downing Jr. and the New Hope Baptist Church for hosting our 2019 Summer TEK and Summer SilverTeks programs, and our Awards Luncheon for the sixth year in a row!

We want to take this opportunity to thank all of you for helping us to provide opportunities for our young people to succeed!



Leroy J. Williams, Jr.

Chief Executive Officer CyberTeK-IQ LLC.

Leroy J. Williams, Jr is currently Founder and Chief Executive Officer of CyberTeK-IQ LLC., a digital strategy and cyber security management consulting firm that partners with technology companies seeking to achieve scale and profitable growth objectives, and with businesses to increase cyber-security awareness and adoption of industry best-practices to reduce exposure.



Prior to CyberTeK-IQ, Leroy worked for 11 years at Ball Corporation (NYSE: BLL), an innovative global metal packaging supplier and parent company of Ball Aerospace Technologies. As the first global chief information officer for Ball Corporation, he was responsible for all aspects of information technology, information security, data analytics, digital innovation, and for supporting growth initiatives in partnership with the company's operating units.

Before joining Ball, Leroy served as the Secretary of Technology and Statewide Chief Information Officer representing the technology sector and driving digital government strategies, respectively. He concurrently chaired the Colorado Information Management Commission and Governor's Commission on Science and Technology. His 3.5 years of public service to Colorado concluded with the appointment as the Executive Director for the Department of Labor and Employment.

Before working in the public sector, Leroy spent 7 years working in the telecommunications industry at U S West / Qwest Communications. His major contributions at Qwest were focused on supply-chainmanagementandB2Bintegration,E-business/digitaltransformationforUSWest/Dex,Inc.,and Local Market Integration for U S WEST Communications including new product launches, customer improvements and retention strategies, and asset rationalization. Prior to his career in telecommunications, Williams worked in the financial services industry in several technical leadership roles focused on the design, development, and deployment of next generation technology solutions.

Leroy currently serves on the board of directors for UMB Financial Corporation (NASDAQ: UMBF), the Daniels Fund Private Foundation, the Colorado Education Initiative as board chair, and the Governor's Education Leadership Council. He served 4 years in the U S Army and trained as a telecommunications and data programming specialist. Williams earned a bachelor's degree in computer information systems from Denver Technical College and an executive MBA from the University of Denver's Daniels College of Business.

SUMMERTEK 2019

SummerTEK is an exciting 6-week, tuition-free summer program offered by Colorado Futuretek. While the program is open to all high school students or incoming freshmen, we make a special effort to recruit African American and other underrepresented minority students.



In SummerTEK classes and labs, our students learn about computer networking, which is projected to be one of the fastest growing career fields over the next decade. The knowledge and skills they acquire in this course can help start them on a path toward innovative and rewarding careers ranging from computer network engineer or administrator to network technician, installer, or help desk technician.

We enroll our students in the Cisco Networking Academy and use the online Introduction to Networks curriculum. In addition to those who may be interested in the high-growth fields of information technology and computer networking as a possible career, this course is also valuable for students who aspire to own their own business.

While learning technical concepts, students also improve their teamwork, problem-solving and verbal/written communication skills.

SummerTEK 2019 students also attended a "Start Your Own Business" seminar provided by Microsoft.

Our SummerTEK students gained valuable training that positions them for future internship opportunities.








ELECTIVE CLASSES AT DSST


